Contributing to the Minnesota Economy

- Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College generate an annual impact of \$331.4 million. This includes a direct impact of \$190.2 million and an indirect/induced impact of \$141.3 million.
- Spending on operations and capital projects generates \$135.1 million of the total impact, and student and visitor spending generates \$196.3 million.

Supporting and Sustaining Jobs in the State

 Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College support and sustain 2,526 Minnesota jobs (1,796 direct and 730 indirect/induced). These jobs are at both colleges and in the communities they serve – 553 direct jobs are employees of Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College. Dakota County

Generating Local and State Tax Revenue

The combined tax impact of Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College, its suppliers, students and visitors is \$26.6 million. This includes a direct impact of \$18 million and indirect/induced impact of \$8.6 million.



Alumni in the State Generate Additional Impact

An estimated 13,840 Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College alumni living and working in Minnesota are continuing to make a positive economic impact after graduation. These graduates are an integral part of the Minnesota workforce, impacting the economy not only through their spending but also through the extra earning power generated by their Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College degree.

Each year, Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College alumni generate \$158.2 million in economic impact for Minnesota and support and sustain 844 jobs. Over their 40-year career, Dakota County Technical College and Inver Hills Community College alumni will generate \$6.3 billion in the economy. These impacts are based on the added value of earning a degree from Dakota County Technical College or Inver Hills Community College, not alumni full wages. This impact is based upon the total number of alumni in Minnesota 10 years after graduation.

Making a Difference in the Community and State
