Community and College/University Cases

- Comparing fall 2020 and fall 2021:
 - Average of weekly cases reported by colleges and universities in 2021 decreased by 27% over 2020 (141 in 2021; 211 in 2020)
 - Employee cases increased by 24% (31 in 2021; 25 in 2020)
 - Student cases decreased by 34% (140 in 2021; 211 in 2020)

College and University Operations

- Continued Focus:
 - Protecting their health and safety
 - Serving students and employees
- Implementing CDC Masking Guidance:
 - Counties with Substantial or High transmission rates
- Vaccine advocacy and promotion
- Vaccination attestation and testing
 - Employees
 - Student groups
- Case monitoring and management



- Requires all Minnesota State employees (including student workers), vendors, contractors and volunteers to provide attestation regarding their COVID vaccination status.
- Until an employee submits proof of full vaccination against COVID, they must undergo mandatory testing for COVID at least weekly.
- NOTE: Employees who are approved for full-time telework from home or otherwise on an approved leave of absence are not subject to the MMB Policy

- Deployed "VaxTrak" systemwide
 - Over 20,804 attestations in "VaxTrak"
- The vast majority of Minnesota State employees (91%) have attested to their vaccination or are exempt under the policy.
 - State cabinet-level agencies have reported an aggregated rate of 77%.
- The remaining 9% are subject to testing protocols
 - On-site facility
 - Contracted testing facility
 - Self-administered options

Minnesota State Student Guidance: Proof of Vaccination and Testing

Student Attestation of Vaccination/Testing Framework

- Applied to specific student populations to mitigate transmission
- Students in residence halls
- Student athletes (already subject to vaccination/testing protocols)
- Extracurricular activities with higher risk of transmission, such as intramural sports, choral ensembles, theater productions, etc.; determined at the campus level
- Students have already been subject to requirements of clinical sites (often include vaccine mandates that go beyond Minnesota State requirements)

Implementation and Administration

- Software attestation tool built and tested in three weeks in student E-services
- Procedure and operating instructions developed in parallel with the tool
- Initial effective date of October 4, 2021, with weekly testing in place shortly thereafter
- System office IT staff: development and iterative updates to the software tool, and build-out of reporting
- Campus investment of staff time and effort to review and certify proof of vaccination, and ongoing need to monitor weekly testing and follow-up with positive cases

 - Central Lakes College: free campus gear and the chance to win additional prizes



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
Campus Vaccination Events




- Community events and clinics hosted on many campuses early in the state's vaccination campaign in spring

- Minnesota State Vax Challenge




County-Level Vaccination Data in Minnesota (Total Population)

HEERF Student Grants disbursed as of October 31, 2021

HEERF I (CARES):

- Primarily disbursed in Spring 2020
- \$46,765,444 from the student grant portion
- \$2,435,201 additional student grants from the institutional portion

HEERF II (CRRSAA):

- Primarily disbursed in Spring 2021
- \$46,259,621 from the student grant portion
- \$15,445,002 additional student grants from the institutional portion

HEERF III (ARP):

- Primarily disbursed during 2021-2022 academic year
- \$80,972,796 from the student grant portion
- \$7,451,148 additional student grants from the institutional portion
- There is a minimum of \$86,000,000 of student grants that will be disbursed between November 1, 2021 and the end of the academic year

American Rescue Plan – Student Grants

- Federal guidance maintains that grants must prioritize students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell grants or are undergraduates with extraordinary financial circumstances
- DACA and international students now eligible
- Grants are provided directly to students and may be used for any cost of attendance; the institutional cannot direct or control how students use the funds
- Campuses submitted distribution plans to the Chancellor

American Rescue Plan –Institutional Portion

- Allowable uses include:
 - Defraying expenses associated with coronavirus (including lost revenue, reimbursement for expenses already incurred, technology costs associated with a transition to distance education, faculty and staff trainings, and payroll)
 - Making additional emergency financial aid grants to students.
- Two new uses required
 - implement evidence-based practices to monitor and suppress COVID-19
 - outreach to financial aid applicants about the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment
